

KUALA LUMPUR, Dec 22 -- Yayasan TRC (YTRC), the philanthropic arm of TRC Synergy Bhd (TRCS), recently distributed food packs to the country's frontliners, especially health workers and law enforcement officers.

These locations were selected as they are located near the Trans Resources Corporation Sdn Bhd (TRC) headquarters and project sites, namely the Sungai Buloh-Serdang-Putrajaya MRT2 Project (Packages DPT201, S208 & V205), as well as the Mixed Development Project in Plot 8MD3, Precinct 8, Putrajaya.

The contribution was presented by TRC acting chief executive officers and YTRC Working Committee deputy chief Siti Sarlina Abdul Rahman, with the top management representatives for each project, as well as YTRC volunteers also present.
